CIRCLE TIME

DID YOU EVER SEE A BIRDIE? Tune: Did You Ever See A Lassie

Messy Play

TWO LITTLE BLACKBIRDS Rhvme

Two little blackbirds sitting on a hill, One named Jack and one named Jill. Fly away Jack. Fly away Jill. Come back Jack. Come back Jill.

Shake roller rattle filled with plastic "seeds" to rhyme.

FEATHERING THE NEST **Group Movement Activity**

Children wave scarves as they fly around the room to the music.

Play meadow background music.

CREATIVE PLAY STATIONS

Free play with theme puzzles, playdoh, stacking boxes with holes and bubbles

• PRETTY BIRDS

Creative Play

Children glue craft feathers on construction paper birds. Label with children's names and take home.

LEAVING THE NEST Communication/Pretend Play

Children play in a plastic wading pool "nest" filled with shredded paper. Children take turns waving "bye" to mommy bird and flying out of the nest and coming back. Use the words, "in," "out," "hi," and "bye."

BIRDHOUSES **Problem Solving Play**

Children and parents play with shoe box birdhouses. Cut entrance holes in the boxes. Children fill houses with shredded paper and fit plastic eggs through the holes.

SNACK TIME

Cream cheese spread on a bagel, chow mein noodle "nest" and milk

HOME PLAY

Set up a bird feeder with your child outside your window. Fill the birdfeeder together. Talk about the numbers, colors and sizes of birds that come to visit. Praise your child. Hug, kiss, smile, and say, "Flyin' high!"
